Lenten Companion Book

You're invited to pick up a copy of *Magnificat* Lenten Companion, a daily Lent devotion book, in the courtyard after all Masses next weekend. Spending just a few minutes a day in prayerful meditation throughout Lent will help you to be open to the graces the Lord has for you in this season and will prepare you to celebrate the Easter. A \$1 donation is requested. Books will also be available in the Parish Office as long as our supply lasts.

Fasting and Abstinence

Catholics practice the discipline of fasting and abstinence as well as prayer and almsgiving during Lent to prepare for the Easter celebration. When we fast and abstain from foods we enjoy we turn away from ourselves and towards God and others in charity.

Fasting: Catholics, from ages 18 through 59, are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by limiting themselves to one full meal and two smaller meals each day. Eating between meals on these days is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.

Abstinence: Catholics ages 14 and older abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent.

PRIMERA LECTURA LEVÍTICO 13, 1-2. 44-46
SEGUNDA LECTURA PRIMERA CORINTIOS 10, 31- 11, 1
EVANGELIO MARCOS 1, 40-45

“si quieres puedes limpiarme, extendiendo su mano lo toco y le dice: Quiero sé limpio”

La semana pasada Jesús curo a la suegra de Pedro de fiebre, enfermedad interna que causa no poder hacer nada. Hoy somos testigos de otro milagro de Jesús, la curación de un leproso, una enfermedad más seria, más dolorosa y vergonzosa. La fiebre mantenía dentro de casa, y afectaba solo a la persona que la sufría, mientras que la lepra afectaba no solo a la persona contagiada sino también a los que le estaban entorno, como su familia, amigos, vecinos y el resto de la sociedad al punto que tenía que irse a vivir al lugar asignado a los leprosos fuera de la zona habitada y cuando alguien pasaba cerca de ellos tenía que gritar: <<soy inmundo>>. Saben que la lepra es una enfermedad altamente contagiosa y corrompe la carne por ello es que la gente no se acercaba a los leprosos.

El evangelio de hoy nos muestra cómo se comporta Jesús frente a un leproso: se conmueve, extiende la mano lo toca y lo cura. Jesús tocó la semana pasada la mano de la suegra de Pedro y la curo, hoy va más lejos: “toca la carne podrida del leproso” hermanos, si esto no es amor ¿qué cosa es? ¿Recuerdan las señales que hemos ido recibiendo por parte Evangelista Marcos sobre Jesús como el mesías? **1)** la voz del Padre en su bautismo: <<este es mi hijo amado, escúchelo>>, **2)** cuando Juan el Bautista les dijo a sus discípulos: <<he ahí al cordero de Dios que quita el pecado del mundo>>, **3)** la expulsión del espíritu inmundo en la sinagoga de Cafarnaúm, **4)** la curación de todo tipo de enfermedades y dolencias.

Hay dos tipos de curaciones: la de por intersección como la curación de la suegra de Pedro y la del leproso de hoy y la otra que es por iniciativa directa de Dios, en este caso de Jesús como el ciego de nacimiento las la resurrección de Lázaro. Pongamos atención al modo que el leproso le pide a Jesús curarlo: se lo pide de rodillas. Jesús atiende ambas peticiones, la de la semana pasada y la de hoy. Jesús se conmueve como Dios, no hay nada imposible para Dios. No tengas miedo acercarte a él, conoce tu sufrimiento, tu fiebre, tu lepra y no le da asco tocarnos al contrario quiere sanarnos, quiere que participemos plenamente de la vida sacramental para experimentar en la tierra la Vida Eterna.

El leproso podía tal vez soportar su enfermedad porque no había cura, pero había una cosa que le dolía más que la enfermedad misma era el aspecto religioso; no poder asistir a los eventos religiosos, no poder ir a la sinagoga, al templo, condenado a vivir impuro el resto de sus días. Como a la suegra de Pedro le podía más no poder servir al invitado de honor como se merecía que la fiebre misma.

Después de la sanación del leproso, tenemos una idea completa de quien es Jesús: 1) expulsa demonios, 2) obra milagros y 3) cura todo tipo de enfermedades y dolencias como fiebre y lepra.

¿Porque Jesús no envió al leproso a un doctor sino a un sacerdote? ¿Sería lo más lógico no? Recuerden que la lepra estaba relacionada a la vida social y religiosa del judío, la lepra era todo lo contrario a lo que Dios es. Dios es puro y perfecto todo lo que se le ofrecía tenía que ser puro y sin defecto, la lepra hacia a la persona impura por ser imperfecta, imagínate muriendo en vida, cayéndose pedazos de carne pudriéndose.

Es verdad que la ciencia y la medicina han avanzado mucho, pero hay ciertos pecados o cosas que nos pasan que tienen que ver con nuestra relación con los demás y con Dios. Al aborto por ejemplo le quieren quietar su sentido de pecado, llamándolo “embarazo no deseado” y que no es un mal social sino “un derecho de la mujer” (como si solo ella lo concibió) y después que no afecta emocionalmente ni psicológicamente a la mujer. Bien sabemos los sacerdotes cuanto sufre una mujer emocional y psicológicamente después de un aborto.

¡Ánimo hermanos! No tengas miedo gritarle a Jesús que cure tu lepra, aquello que te impide estar cerca de los tuyos como puede ser tu orgullo, tu ira, tu soberbia, tu vicio, solo tú sabes, y que a su vez te aleja de la vida religiosa, de estar en la iglesia, el estar cerca de Dios porque como dice el Salmo **84, 10**: “vale más un día en tus atrios que mil fuera de ellos”
